3-Point and Free Throw Competition

Divisions

1. There will be two divisions, with a winner declared for each division.
 - a. Men's
 - b. Women's

Registration

- Registration will be done on the night of Competition (Thursday, April 8, 2010) at the Student Rec Center, Basketball Court # 5.
 - Registration will begin at 7:00PM and end at 10:00PM
- Eligibility requirements for the Free Throw and 3 Point Competition are the same as any other Intramural Sport.

- All participants must present a valid student ID to participate.
- Upon completing registration, the participant will then proceed to their respective contest.

Free Throw Competition

- Each participant will be given twenty five (20) free throw attempts.
 - The official shall record a make or miss on each attempt
- If after 20 shots the participant has a shooting percentage of at least eighty percent (80%), the participant will be awarded, ten (10) additional shots.
 - The official shall record a make or miss on each attempt.
- In the event of a tie after thirty five (30) shots, the tie breaker will be based on most consecutive made attempts.

3 Point Competition

- Each participant will have five (5) racks of five (5) basketballs to attempt.
- The participant will have one minute and thirty seconds (1:30) to attempt all twenty-five (25) shots.
- The first four (4) balls on each rack will be worth one (1) point. The 5th ball will be a "money ball" and will be worth two (2) points.
 - An official will be present to record all shots as makes or misses
 - In order for a try to be successful, the participant must have both feet behind the 19'9 line when he/she begins their attempt. If the participant has a foot on the line or in front of the line, the shot will not be counted, and will not be redone.
 - No shot will be counted if it is released AFTER the horn sounds. (The ball must be in flight when time expires for the attempt to count.)
- In the event of a tie, a tie breaker will be determined by:
 - Number of Money Balls Made
 - Number of Consecutive Shots Made
 - If there is still a tie then two winners will be declared.
